Holden man assaulted in home invasion

A Holden man was attacked by three intruders at his home on Woodridge Road Friday afternoon.

The son of homeowner Qiao Qin Yang reported to police at 1:17 p.m. on January 25 that three Asian men were in the home at 167 Woodridge Road. The victim went to a neighbor's to get help after returning home to find the three men, who assaulted him. The victim was hit with a pipe, club or crowbar, Holden Police Chief George Sherrill said. The victim was treated at the scene and did not require hospitalization.

No inventory of the items taken was available as The Landmark went to press.

Police are investigating the relationship, if any, between the perpetrators and the homeowner.

A description of the intruders and their vehicle as well as a partial license plate number was given, Sherrill said. The intruders are described as Asian men who departed the scene in a black van with New York plates.

No suspects had been apprehended by the time The Landmark went to press Tuesday, but Sherrill said he was confident that the act was not part of a crime wave that should concern residents.

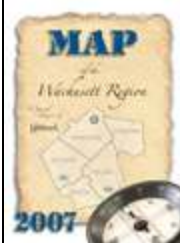
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"Citizens should be assured that this is a very isolated act for the town of Holden," Sherrill said.
