Area teens arrested in Valentine's Day break-ins

Four area teens were arrested on Valentine's night after residents on Mixer Road and Jennifer Drive reported thefts from unlocked vehicles parked in their driveways around 10 p.m.

Thomas Loughlin and Ryan Miller of Rutland and Patrick Crowley and Jay Anderson of Holden, all 17, were arrested after being stopped by police on Reservoir Road around 11 p.m. in a vehicle that matched a description given by a Jennifer Drive resident.

That resident reported to police that a vehicle pulled into his driveway and parties got out and went through his vehicle. That call followed a similar report by a Mixer Road resident, who reported a vehicle stopping at the end of the dead end street. He then investigated and noted items missing from his vehicles. When police stopped the Blue Oldsmobile Alero, driven by Loughlin, they found tools identified by the Mixer Road victim as those stolen from his property.

All four teens were charged with malicious destruction of property over \$250 and conspiracy. Thomas Loughlin, 17, of 8 Rebecca Ann Dr., Rutland was also charged with breaking and entering of a vehicle in the nighttime for a felony, larceny over \$250, and larceny under \$250. Ryan Miller, 17, of 41 Laurelwood Rd., Rutland was charged with three counts of breaking and entering a vehicle in the nighttime for a felony, two counts of larceny over \$250, and two counts of larceny under \$250. Patrick Crowley, 17, of 28 Surrey Lane, Holden was charged with three counts of breaking and entering a vehicle in the nighttime for a felony; one count of entering a vehicle/boat in the nighttime for a felony, larceny under \$250 by single scheme, larceny over \$250, and two counts of larceny under \$250. Jay S. Anderson, 17, of 242 Bailey Rd., Holden was charged with breaking and entering a vehicle in the nighttime for a felony, larceny over \$250, and larceny under \$250.

Detective Al Bourget is investigating.

Among the aspects of the crime police are investigating is whether they are related to other recent breaks in town: the Valentine's Day thefts come just a week after another Saturday night vehicle break-in spree, and Holden Police Chief George Sherrill said there were more breaks and a car theft during the night on February 16.

Nearly a dozen calls reporting unlocked vehicles broken into or items missing from vehicles came in on February 7 and 8, and Sherrill says there may be more thefts people haven't yet noticed because the items taken were small.

In other vehicles the stolen items included GPS units and other electronics.
